

nyone that has attended Grace Community Church for more than a week probably knows Ryan McFadden. Even if you don't know his name, you recognize his smile and feel his energy across the lobby. This is not by accident. God has gifted Ryan with skills that enable him to connect, organize, and orchestrate all kinds of activities. He knows how to pull people together to meet for the first time and how to get strangers to work toward a common goal. His heart for service has suited him well as our Facilities Director – recruiting volunteers for work, managing projects, etc. But we think that his skills can be put to better use.

Another thing you might have noticed at Grace is that we have a fairly large staff. It isn't true that there are no volunteers or volunteer-led programs, but most official activities of the church are overseen by staff people. There is nothing sinful or wrong about this approach. But it isn't always helpful because it can discourage church members and attenders from getting involved. It also incorrectly communicates that the church is a place where you are served, as opposed to serving with people.

Our Elder Board and Senior Leadership Team saw these two realities and realized a possible solution staring us in the face. We desired to see more people in the church involved at more levels. There were specific volunteer efforts we knew would benefit the church in profound ways. And Ryan McFadden was already a key part of our community, well-suited to help volunteers get organized, and gifted by God with a heart to serve those around him. A new direction for the church was in order, and a new position for Ryan was part of the answer. That is why on July 1, 2023, Ryan McFadden changed roles from Facilities Director to Volunteer Engagement Director.

In his new role, Ryan will continue to oversee the Safety and Security Team. That was the major volunteer team he was already leading. Then he will begin to work with all of our other volunteers. That work will be minimal in some departments, encouraging and supporting only. But there are many areas where the church would like to see significant growth in volunteer work. One of those initiatives will be Ryan's primary focus this next year: establishing the Grace Care Team.

Everyone has physical needs. Sometimes these needs require help that far exceeds our ability. The Grace Care Team - which you will hear more about soon - will be a volunteer team focused directly on meeting physical needs in our church community. This team will need men and women to serve as leaders and initiators. Ryan will lead the initial efforts, but

many other helpers will run this team to serve Grace and our neighbors.

The church leadership is excited about this change. Ryan is excited, too. When you see him, congratulate him on the new role. And get ready, we'll be building more volunteer teams very soon. So have a conversation with God now, and ask him to give you a servant's heart.






AT OUR JUNE MEMBERS MEETING, Brooks and I discussed the plans we have for our property on Kansas Avenue in North Liberty. Those plans include a new building and moving most of the congregation in our current facility to that new building in about seven to ten years.

Why so long? If the church needs a new building, why not start building it right away?

Grace Community Church might need a new building in a few years. But more than that, the people who attend Grace need to live active lives of discipleship. The pastors, elders, and leadership team at Grace long to see the members and attenders following Jesus more faithfully. This means placing more emphasis on knowing and understanding God's word. This means giving greater attention to prayer. This means ensuring more instances of sharing the gospel with people who don't know Jesus. If we branch out into a new building before first building up the congregation in terms of personal discipleship and disciple making, we are doing our work in the wrong order.

Expect to hear more about the need to make new disciples. And expect to hear more regarding making new communities of disciples.

Thankfully, no new building is needed to follow Jesus more closely. We can do that right away, and the church should expect to hear more in the coming months about the values they can pursue and the steps they can take to follow Christ faithfully. Expect to hear more about the need to make

Communities of Christians are essential to the spread of the gospel. Brooks shared at the meeting about the fact that starting new communities of disciples and church planting is one of the most effective means of bringing people to Christ. From experience we know that when a new Christian community comes to a town or region, it brings opportunities to talk about Jesus with people who may never have spoken about God with anyone.

What experience is that? Grace has been a part of multiple church plants in the last ten years. One of those is official: Grace planted River City Church in Riverside, IA, about five years ago. Other church plants are unofficially connected to Grace (Jordan Creek in Solon) or in the process (Amana Fellowship). But with all of these interactions, we have seen the value of church planting, and it has helped to clarify our church's mission for the future.

At the beginning of this article, I said that in 7-10 years, most of the congregation that attends Grace will move to that new facility on Kansas Avenue. We expect some people not to move to that new building because part of our plans involves planting a new church in our old building. The mission of that new church, which will meet in our current facility, will be to reach the people who live along Dubuque Street in North Liberty, Coralville, and Iowa City. The mission of Grace Community Church in its new facility will be amended to focus on planting churches in Eastern Iowa. When the move is complete and several transition steps have taken place, there will be two churches with two distinct missions. We expect most of the current congregation will go to the new building, but we hope some people will be interested in helping plant that new church.

Ultimately, we want Grace Community Church to be a church that plants churches. It is true that right now, many growth steps need to take place before we can go and do the work of multiplying one congregation into two or more. But our long-term goal is two, three, four, or more new Christian communities in Eastern lowa: new church plants, new community groups, new service groups, and so on. Because as I said above, one of the best ways to spread the gospel is by making new communities of disciples. **



TAKE YOUR NEXT STEP
